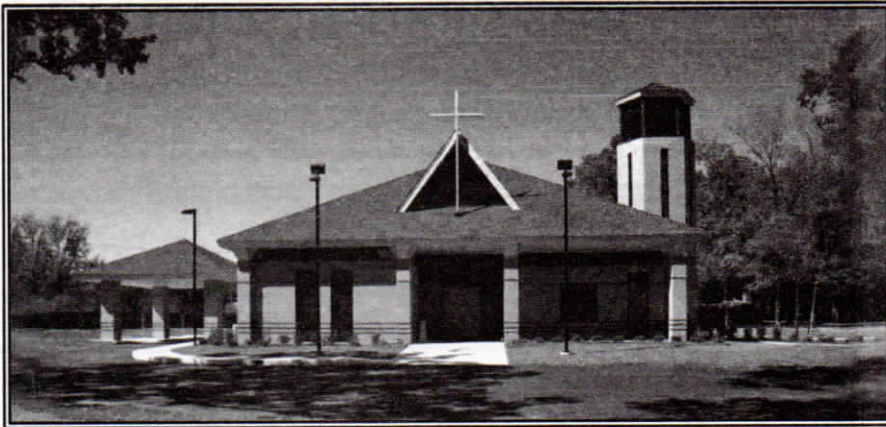

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

JANUARY 22, 2017

Isaiah 8:23-9:3; 1 Corinthians 1:10-13,17;
 Matthew 4:12-23

A better translation of today's first reading might help. It might read, "In former times he degraded Zebulun and Naphthali, but in the latter time, he will make glorious the way of the sad, the land west of the Jordan, and Galilee of the nations."

The territory of Zebulun and Naphthali was the first to be conquered by the Assyrians in the time of Isaiah. But Isaiah promised that Ahaz and his son Hezekiah would be protected from the Assyrian onslaught.

Jesus was reared in the area called Zebulun and Naphthali; it was considered pagan Galilee by the religious professionals at Jerusalem. The contempt was expressed by Nathaniel when he said, "Can any good come from Nazareth?"

In God's providence, however, this "pagan" territory was eager to hear the Good News. Light for the entire world came from this land of "darkness." Matthew sees the "prophecy" of Isaiah fulfilled in Jesus, the light of the world. Jesus calls on us to reform our lives, for the kingdom is near.

The second reading (the "continuous reading") is usually not connected with the other two Scriptures. The Corinthians were torn apart by dissension, bickering, and infighting. They were a fairly "low rent" people, terribly insecure, who wanted to "be somebody." Paul tells them that true wisdom is to be found in the cross of Christ. If they belong to Christ, they cannot be divided or torn by dissension.

One of the messages today is that God can write straight with crooked lines. He can make somebodies out of nobodies, and bring light to those in darkness. He can even change our lives, if we let him!

The Church: We have seen that the gift of infallibility is granted to those who proclaim the revelation and to those who receive it. It should be noted that God alone is infallible in the full sense of the term. And God is generous enough to share it with His people, the Church. The hierarchy guides the lives of the faithful who respond to the revelation. The hierarchy, in union with the Pope, has the authority to pass judgment on what has been revealed. But when it is received by the Church, it undergoes limitations:

1) It works with the Church only in matters of faith and morals. 2) The whole faithful should hold the point of doctrine pertaining to these matters unhesitatingly. 3) It always depends on the guidance of the Holy Spirit who leads the Church into all the truth. The Vatican Council says, "That the university of the faithful, whom, the Holy Spirit has anointed, is incapable of error in belief. This is a property which belongs to the people from bishops to most obscure layman, they show their universal agreement in matters of faith and morals." Here "universal" does not mean a mathematical understanding of covering the whole or all, rather, universal means different persons are joined together in some common enterprise. Now what does the "university of the faithful" mean? They are the faithful who are grouped into one by their common allegiance to the faith. We know the saying, "truth unites and error divides". What they believe is objectively true. Therefore, those who are part of the university take the universal agreement and adhere to it because God has revealed it. Whether they realize it or not, all who agree on the revealed truth belong to the faithful. Their agreement on the truth gives them universality, i.e., spiritual unity. Like Mary, they ponder these truths in their hearts; thereby spiritual matters are penetrated into their lives and it helps them to live and practice what they believe. Father Joe
