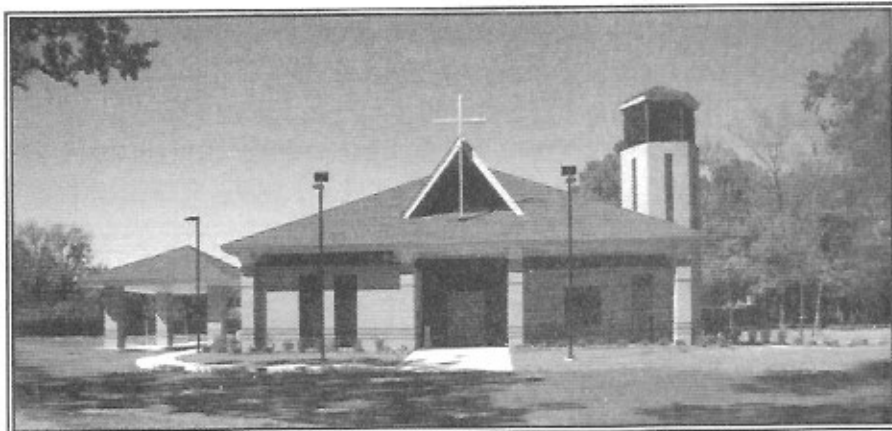

## Pentecost Sunday

MAY 15, 2016

*Vigil:* Genesis 11:1-9 or Exodus 19:3-8a,  
 16-20b or Ezekiel 37:1-14 or Joel 3:1-5;  
 Romans 8:22-27; John 7:37-39.  
*On the day itself:* Acts 2:1-11;  
 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7, 12-13;  
 John 20:19-23

On Sunday, after the second reading, the Sequence "Veni Sancte Spiritus" (*Come Thou Holy Spirit, Come*) is sung. Only two sequences remain in our Roman liturgy, one at Easter and one at Pentecost. At the end of Mass, the Paschal Candle is extinguished, a sign that the Easter season is over.

Our first reading describes the coming of the Holy Spirit in power. The rushing wind, the quaking, and the fire are intended to recall the theophany of Mt. Sinai, when Moses received the Torah. The inaugural of the new covenant recalls the theophany of the covenant made with Moses.

The theophany is also a "substitute parousia." Jews expected the glorious coming in power of the Messiah; they believed that all wrongs would be righted, that all suffering would cease, that the dead would rise, and that there would be perfect peace and justice forever when the Messiah came.

There would also be the outpouring of God's Spirit. It didn't happen exactly that way. The Spirit comes, and the community of the Church is empowered by the Spirit. But the full perfection of the kingdom must wait for a while.

"Pentecost" means "fiftieth." It was a Jewish festival which celebrated the full harvest of wheat and the inaugural of the covenant of Mt. Sinai. In our Christian Pentecost, the harvest is not of wheat, but of people - all the people of the earth are called to salvation. Even in the Jewish festival, there were overtones of the inclusion of Gentiles in salvation! This has now been fulfilled.

In the second reading, Paul describes the variety of the gifts of the Holy Spirit. All gifts are to be used for the building up of the Church in unity of faith and love. The Gospel describes Jesus' conferral of the Holy Spirit on Easter: The Spirit enables the Church to do what Christ himself had done: to forgive sins, to teach truth, and to sanctify all people.

**Ten Commandment:** Now let us see what the eighth commandment teaches us. It says, "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor". But since the basis of this commandment is love your neighbor as yourself, we do not want anyone to say any untruth about us in a court of law or in our personal relationship. In any case, we will lose our status in our community. So we should speak only absolute truth. Everyone involved in a case in the court of law should be able to take full responsibility for the decision. If their statement was found false at any time, they deserve the same penalty that would have fallen on the person found guilty falsely. Old Testament insists that we should take witness from two or three and not just one. The Old Testament held that the people of God should be firm, steady, reliable, trustworthy, and faithful. For them, a "man of truth" was a man who could be depended on, even as a "road of truth" was the right road that takes you to destiny. They considered a "judgement of truth" as a decision based on facts. The New Testament also holds the same idea and tells us that those who speak the truth can be believed. His statements produce conviction, and that their friendship brings peace. Moreover, truth should be objective. Telling the truth is not merely saying what is on one's mind, because it is derived by reasoning or revelation and influenced by personal experience and judgment and, therefore, it is subjective. Objectively, truth means communicating what is real, what actually exists, or what actually took place. Ultimately, the sins of tongue are sins of untruth and is infidelity toward God who is truth. Apostle James says, "The only man who could reach perfection would be someone who would never say anything wrong; he would be able to control every part of himself". Once the tongue is duly restrained, mastery has been achieved over the heart." Father Joe
