## Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

MAY 22, 2016

Proverbs 8:22-31; Romans 5:1-5;  
John 16:12-15

From all eternity, there is only one God. From all eternity, there are Three Persons in this one God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. As far as their attributes, whatever can be said of the Father, can also be said of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. The Father is eternal, almighty, infinite in perfection; so also is the Son; so also is the Holy Spirit.

But there are not three "almighties" or three "eternals," but only one almighty, eternal God infinite in perfection. The Father is not the Son and the Holy Spirit. They are distinct Persons who share and completely possess the one nature of God.

From all eternity, the Father begets the Son; from all eternity, the Son is born of the Father. From all eternity, the Holy Spirit proceeds from the Father and the Son. (The Oriental Churches express this as "from the Father through the Son.")

In time, about 7 B.C., only the Son became incarnate: The Word was made flesh. The Second Person of the Trinity became fully man without ceasing to be God. Jesus Christ is equal to the Father in his divinity, but less than the Father in his humanity: But he is One Person, ever to be adored in his majesty.

All of this is very heady theology! In fact, absolutely nothing is known of the Trinity in the Old Testament. Only Jesus reveals to us this central mystery of our faith. He revealed it as the practical basis of our spiritual life.

The Father loves us with an everlasting love; yet, in the Old Testament, he seems clouded in unapproachable light. We can scarcely visualize him as a Person. He seems so far above us. The Eternal Son of God became man to show us the Father. When we see Jesus, we see the love of the Father. He is one of us. He is our access to the Father, our Mediator, our Savior. He assures us of the Father's forgiveness. He is the model of what God intended us to be. He gave his life for us. In him, we can have confidence in approaching the Father.

But we no longer see Jesus; he has returned to the glory of the Father. He has not left us orphans, however. He has sent the Holy Spirit, the "Paraclete." "Paraclete" means "one who stands by." He stands by us as our advocate, as our defense attorney against all the trials of this earth. He stands by us to comfort us and strengthen us. He stands by us to make us one in Christ Jesus. He manifests the Son to us, just as the Son manifested the Father.

In the Holy Spirit, we are joined with Mary and all the saints in Christ. Our spiritual life, then, must be rooted in the mystery of the Trinity. We give glory TO the Father, THROUGH the Son, IN the Holy Spirit, WITH the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints! Let us live and pray as we profess to believe.

**Ten Commandments:** In moral order, verbal and written communication between or among people is very important. When we try to build up a Christian community, truthful and respectful communication is the essential component. Therefore, the Catholic Church is very particular about careful teaching on the communication the right way. A person who has one thing on his mind and communicates something else either in words or by any kind of signs is a liar. Therefore, lying means speaking deliberately contrary to what is on a person's mind. A man of mental conflict or a distracted person may say many things but he may not be aware of what he is saying. Therefore, it is not a lie if he is not sufficiently aware of what he says and intends to say it. It will be a lie only when there is opposition between what he says and what he thinks. It all depends on what I think. So, I would be lying if I actually tell the truth but thought that my statement was false. And, I would not lie if what I said was actually false but I believed it was true. The persons to whom we talk is important. Thus, telling children about Santa Claus is not lying. In the same way, circumstances, time, place and tone of voice tells upon the truth of communication. Thus, hyperboles as we read in the Scripture is not lie. An example can be stated from the fourth gospel. It says, "If we write everything what Jesus said, I suppose, the world would not have enough space to hold it" (21,25). What is said ironically is not lie. Writers of fiction fabricate all kinds of unreal narratives, but they are not telling lies. In the same category are jokes because the humor suggests the that hearers not to take the content seriously. But in such circumstances, the one who speaks should be charitable. Generally, lies are venial sins but in serious matters, it can be a really grave sin. Father Joe
