Second Sunday of Advent

DECEMBER 4, 2016

Isaiah 11:1-10; Romans 15:4-9;
Matthew 3:1-12

Two hundred fifty years before Isaiah wrote, God promised that the dynasty of David would last forever. (See 2 Samuel 7:11-17.) But the descendants of David were a sorry lot. They were weak, corrupt, and faithless kings. Nevertheless, Isaiah — and the rest of the Bible preserves the tradition which contradicted their experience.

Isaiah sees that a “righteous shoot” shall spring from the “dead stump” of Jesse (David’s father). Isaiah calls on us to have hope, even when it contradicts our experience. Isaiah gives a beautiful picture of paradise which will come when the Messiah comes: The wolf shall be guest of the lamb; the leopard shall lie down with the kid ... etc.

In the second reading, Paul urges us to have hope because of the example of patience in our spiritual ancestors. He urges us to accept each other because Christ has accepted us: Whether we are Jew or Gentile, the Lord has had mercy on us all. Therefore we should glorify him by our charity toward each other.

The Gospel is a fiery sermon of John the Baptist. He calls the good people of his day (the Pharisees) a “nest of snakes!” He calls for everyone to turn his life around in order to escape the punishment his sins deserve. No one likes to hear a hurtful truth; but the truth is necessary for our spiritual conversion.

Let us pray today that we may have hope even when things seem hopeless, and that we may always follow the truth — even when it hurts.

The Church - When we proclaim our Creed, we profess, "We believe in one holy, Catholic and apostolic Church. We say the Church is holy because her founder, Christ is holy and Christ is holy because he is God and we all are sinners. The Church's sanctity leads her to Christ. The purpose of founding the Church on earth is that the Church may make herself holy and suitable for heaven. The letter to Ephesians says, "Christ loved the Church and handed Himself over to death for her to sanctify her, cleansing her by His blood that He might present the Church in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish." The Church in turn uses means to sanctify her children. The Church is using the doctrine of faith and morals, the sacraments, especially reconciliation and Mass, the directions of those in ecclesiastical authority, and the communion of saints that impart their merits. At the center of these means of holiness and their ultimate source is the indwelling Spirit of Christ, who animates the Mystical Body. These means are available to everyone and meant for the faithful of Christ to come to the fullness of Christian life and the perfection of charity. The Church also demands that each one uses his own free will and the faculties that God has granted to us and co-operate with the channels of grace offered by the Church. We should follow in Christ's footsteps and conform ourselves to God's image by seeking the will of the Father in all things through the guidance of the Holy Spirit. The glory of God and service of His people must be the priority of each one of us. The fruitfulness of sanctity proclaims the validity of the Church's teaching on and the practice of holiness. 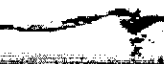
