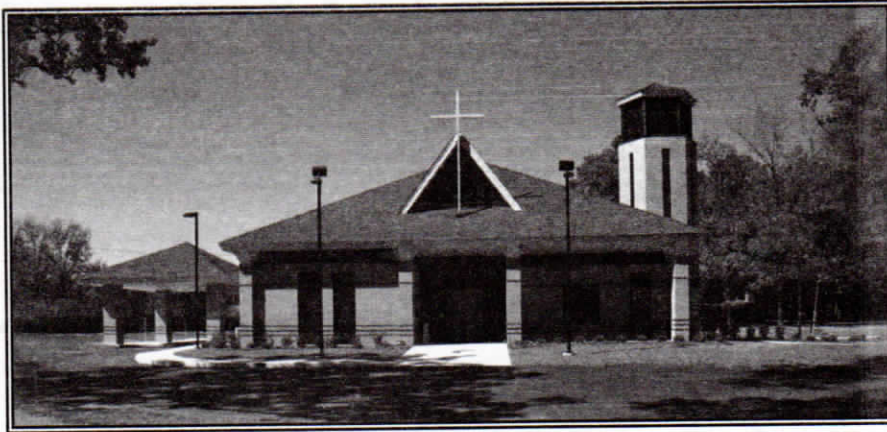

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

JANUARY 15, 2017

Isaiah 49:3,5-6; 1 Corinthians 1:1-3;
John 1:29-34

We return to "Ordinary Time." This is not a very happy expression; a better name would be "The Season of the Church." During this season, we reflect on the meaning of Church.

Who are we as a people? The liturgical color is green, the color of hope and of life. Our second reading tells us that we are called to be a holy people. Holiness means that we answer promptly to the Lord's invitation.

Our Responsorial Psalm refrain must be our ready response: "Here am I, Lord; I come to do your will." Jesus came to do the will of his Father. He is the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. He is anointed by the Spirit. He is God's Chosen One.

Our first reading is from the second (of four) "Suffering Servant Songs" in Isaiah. These songs tell of a person who takes all grief and sin to himself, and by his suffering, he vicariously heals all.

As Christians, we share in the mission of Christ. We have been anointed with his Spirit (in Confirmation). We are called to change this world. As the second reading tells us, we have been consecrated in Christ Jesus, and called to be a holy people.

Like John, in the Gospel, we may not always recognize Christ in our world. Yet we must pray for faith always to see him in every person and in every situation. Let us pray that we shall be loyal to Christ in seeking to eliminate sin and to bring virtue to our world.

The Church: Another gift that God has granted to Catholic Church is infallibility in belief and in doctrine. It means that the Church is immune from making error in certain areas of spiritual life. It does not affect the Church as an institution but it affects people. And it does not mean that they will not make any mistake in their lives or they are immune from committing any sin. Only the Blessed Mother had inborn resistance to sin known as impeccability. Infallibility is a special divine grace that enlighten the minds of the people in question to insure inerrancy. Since the transmission of truth involves a speaker and a listener, both speaker and listener enjoy infallibility. Infallibility must not be mistaken for revelation or inspiration. In case of revelation, God internally enlightens the human mind to acknowledge what God communicates as new truth at least to the one who receives the revelation it is new. Infallibility, on the other hand, God specifically prevents the error to get in when the revelation is declared. God inspires someone to write or to do something or inspires to read the sign that God gives him/her, properly. In the case of inspiration, God is the author but He uses human instruments. With relation to inspiration, infallibility is the providence of God, so that the inspired material may be transmitted without error. In Acts 4,12, we read Peter's declaration before the Sanhedrin, "Of all the names in the world given to men the name of Jesus is the only one by which we can be saved". From this we understand that God revealed this to Peter and God inspired him to proclaim it with courage and kept him from making any error. Luke tells us that Peter was filled with the Holy Spirit. Here, St. Luke also is divinely inspired to transmit the truth. We believe that the Church's teaching is infallible when she speaks about faith and morals. Father Joe.
